"FEAR NOT..."

That night, Christmas Eve, I had an invitation. For weeks my drinking had been at its worse. I was afraid that this Christmas would turn out like the one last year, and the year before that. I grasped desperately at that invitation which had been given me by a friend who wanted me to spend a little while with Him at his house on Christmas Eve. That, in spite of the fact that so often before I had disappointed Him, kept Him waiting, ignored Him. For a few days I had been sober. Things seemed somewhat better at home, and there was hope that this Christmas might somehow be different. But I could see beneath that faint look of hope the cold shadow of fear. My record, my broken promises, left no basis for hope. It was snowing hard when I started out for my friend's house. I went eagerly, for I knew that He would understand, that He knew how I hated this thing, that I was trying hard. I wanted to ask Him to help me just once more, because this time I would do it. So I trudged through the snow toward his house. I knew that I would be uneasy there, for the jumpy nerves of that last awful drunk had not yet quieted. But this evening would see the end of all that. After tonight, after I had left my friends house, there would be no more of it. My nervousness, however—that was bad. Just one drink would ease things so that I could get the most out of my visit to my friend. I convinced myself that it would be a discourtesy to Him for me to come shaky and restless like that, and, after all, I was going to stop that night. This, I reasoned, was the sensible thing to do. I'd step into "Eddie's Lounge," only half a block from my friend's house, and get just one for those nerves. There was time enough—over twenty minutes yet. Content with the clever way in which I had figured out everything, pleased with the prospect of a drinkless tomorrow. I went in... I think that when I came to Him just before Christmas a year later, and told Him that I could no longer fight this alone, that I was unequal to the battle, He beckoned to two friends of His. They were men who, having been as I was, could supply what I lacked, point away from the wrong road I had followed. I like to think that He smiled at them as they fought their way through Detroit's slush and snow to reach me. This year I shall go to my friend's house on Christmas Eve again, for in spite of everything, He has invited me. This time, God willing, and with the help of AA it will be another happy Christmas. "Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tiding of great joy..."


A LETTER FROM SANTA CLAUS

SELF-SUPPORT-November 2017

© Today in November of 2017 we have 224 Groups with 565 meetings a week. Contributions in November totaled \$ 7,825.38. That accounts for what 439 Groups out of 224 Groups in our area have contributed in November. Our total income for November was \$16,019.89. Our Cost of Goods Sold was \$6,133.61. Subtracting the Cost of Goods Sold from our November income left us with a Gross Profit of 9,886.28. Our Total Expenses for November were \$8,212.05. Subtracting our Expenses from our Gross Profit gave us a Net Income of plus+\$1,674.23 for the month of November. This leaves us with a total of minus-\$1,156.06 in the red for the year thus far. No matter how good or bad it may appear that we are doing from one month to another, it takes your consistent contributions to keep us operating on a steady level. As our AA membership continues to grow in the Tampa Bay area, the demand for more and more material and services continue to expand and we continue to try and strive to keep up with the demand.
